Tim Moore, O. Carm., Dies In NJ at 90 Longtime New Jersey pastor and teacher at St. Cecilia in Englewood

The Rev. Timothy E. Moore, O. Carm., 90, died at the Community Medical Center in Toms River, NJ on April 5, 2001. He had been living in retirement in nearby Lakehurst, NJ.

A wake service was held on Sunday, April 8, at 7 PM, in St. John's Church, Leonia, NJ, where Tim had been a longtime pastor.

A concelebrated Mass of Christian Burial was held at St. John's Church on Monday, April 9, at 11 AM. The Very Rev. Leo McCarthy, O. Carm., prior provincial of the Most Pure Heart of Mary Province, was the principal celebrant, along with the Very Rev. John Welch, O. Carm., provincial of the Eastern Commissary. The Rev. Ronald Gray, O. Carm., associate pastor of St. John's was the homilist.

Burial followed at Mt. Carmel Cemetery in Tenafly, NJ.

Tim Moore was born in Corona, NY on May 16, 1910, the son of the late William and Mary (Pierce) Moore. The family then moved to New Jersey where Tim attended St. Anastasia School in Teaneck and St. Cecilia High School in Englewood.

Following graduation, Tim joined the Carmelite Order at Mt. Carmel College in


Niagara Falls, ONT, and professed his first vows there on August 15, 1930.

On May 26, 1935, Tim was ordained to the priesthood in Chicago, IL and then assigned to teaching at Mt. Carmel High School there. From 1936-1941, he was an associate pastor at St. Mary's Carmelite Church in downtown Joliet, IL, while also teaching at Joliet Catholic High School. He was also appointed Catholic Youth Organization director for Will County. He later served as associate pastor at the former St. Clara's (now Gelasius) Church in Chicago, IL.

From 1942-1954, Fr. Moore worked at St. Cecilia Church in Englewood, NJ, while also teaching at St. Cecilia High School and serving as the school's athletic director. He was responsible for hiring Vince Lonbardi as a coach at the high school.

From 1954-66, Fr. Moore served as pastor of St. John's Church in Leonia, NJ and then served there as an associate pastor until 1971, when he was appointed director of Carmel Retreat House in Mahwah, NJ. He remained there until 1976 when he retired to St. Cecilia Priory in Englewood, NJ.

He also served two terms as a member of
